Causes of the Spanish-American War


- Publishers: William
 Randolph Hearst and
 Joseph Pulitzer
- Yellow Journalism
- Sensational news stories – sometimes exaggerated
- Sinking of the <u>U.S.S.</u>
 <u>Maine</u> caused many to call for War



Fighting Spain


- Two Fronts of battle:
- Cuba and the Philippines
- Teddy Roosevelt leads the Rough Riders in Cuba
- US Navy battles in the Philippines

War Ends – The Results

- Armistice Aug. 1898 and Treaty of Paris Dec. 1898
- America gains Guam, Puerto Rico, (and the Philippines)
- Cuba became a "protectorate" of the United States


