

The Farewell Address, 1797

"It serves always to distract the public councils and enfeeble the public administration. **It** agitates the community with illfound jealousies and false alarms; kindles the animosity of one part against another; foments [incites] occasionally riot and insurrection. It opens the door to foreign influence and corruption."





The Farewell Address, 1797 - cont'd

- In his Farewell Address
 Washington gave his final advice:
- 1.) Beware against the **dangers** of political parties!
- 2.) The USA should remain **neutral** and **isolated** to protect our interests
