Cold War Alliances

- USA forms NATO in 1949 (Atlas pg. 95 top)
- North Atlantic Treaty Organization
- WHY?

The North Atlantic Treaty – Charter [Agreement]

The Parties to this Treaty reaffirm their faith in the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and their desire to live in peace with all peoples and all governments. They are determined to safeguard the freedom, common heritage and civilisation of their peoples, founded on the principles of democracy, individual liberty and the rule of law. They seek to promote stability and well-being in the North Atlantic area. They are resolved to unite their efforts for collective defence and for the preservation of peace and security. They therefore agree to this North Atlantic Treaty...

What was significant about NATO?

Article 5

The Parties agree that an armed attack against one or more of them in Europe or North America shall be considered an attack against them all and consequently they agree that, if such an armed attack occurs, each of them, in exercise of the right of individual or collective self-defence recognised by Article 51 of the Charter of the United Nations, will assist the Party or Parties so attacked by taking forthwith, individually and in concert with the other Parties, such action as it deems necessary, including the use of armed force, to restore and maintain the security of the North Atlantic area.

Cold War Alliances (Cont'd)

- USSR forms the Warsaw Pact in 1954 (Atlas pg. 95 top)
- WHY?
- In response to West Germany's admittance to NATO
- How did the Soviets feel about it?
- Threatened!
- Is the WORLD divided now?
- YOU BET! ☺

Cold War Gets Hot

(Atlas pgs. 92-93)

- Why?
- Korea divided in 1945 into occupation zones
- North = USSR, South = US
- Why divided?
- Former Japanese colony that's now "Free"
- 1948 1949: the USA and USSR leave Korea



Causes for the Korean War

(Atlas pgs. 92-93)


- North Korea dominated by communists
- South Korea dominated by democratic-capitalists
- Start of War?
- North invades South in 1950
- What is this?
- A CIVIL WAR!
- So how did the USSR and USA get involved?

Events of the Korean War

(Atlas pgs. 92-93)

- USSR gave approval to N.K. for invasion
- China joins N.K. later to defend communism
- USA sends support to S.K. via the United Nations
- Why?
- CONTAINMENT!
- Proxy War = USSR and USA never fought directly!
- Back and forth until <u>stalemate</u>
- What ends the war?
- An armistice in 1953 Korea divided along the 38th parallel – FOREVER!
