

## CITING ELECTRONIC PUBLICATIONS IN MLA STYLE

The purpose of any citation is to allow the person reading your report to find and read your information. Include the following in your citations:

- Author (Last name, first name.)
- Titles of books, magazines and newspapers are underlined. On the other hand, the title of an article, from a newspaper or magazine, is enclosed in quotation marks.
- Publication information for books (publisher, place of publication and copyright date.)
- Name of the database underlined (The New York Times Historical Edition.)
- Include the name of the website that hosts the online database. Do not underline or put this name in quotation marks, e.g., ProQuest Direct.
- The date the article or book was originally published in print format.
- The date you read the article online.
- Include the internet address enclosed in angled brackets. If the address is too long include only the home page and directions to the specific page where you found the article or information. <<http://proquest.umi.com/pqdweb>>

### FORMATTING WORKS CITED PAGE

The same formatting rules apply to electronic citations as to print citations:

- The list of sources is printed on a separate page. The title, Works Cited, is centered at the top of the page.
- Alphabetize works cited by author's last name or by first significant word of the title.
- Begin each entry at the left margin. If an entry runs more than one line indent all subsequent lines 5 spaces, or ½ inch, from the left margin.
- Double space throughout your report and on the works cited page.
- One inch margins all around the page. Left justify only. Font size is 12 and use only Arial or Times New Roman font.
